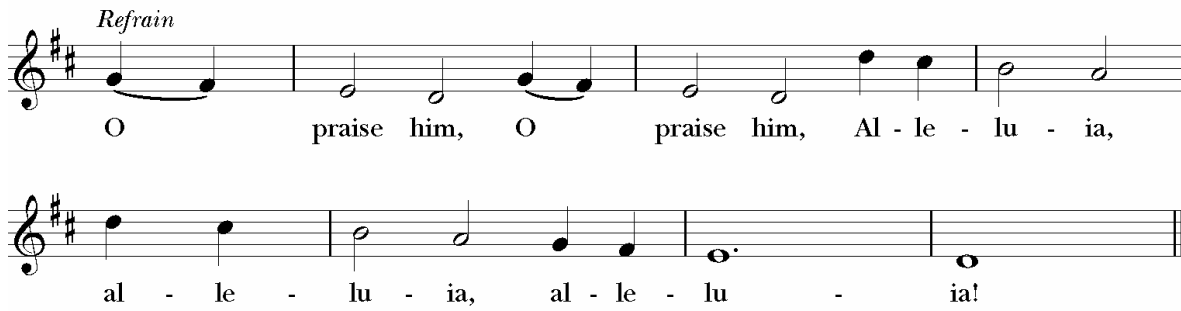

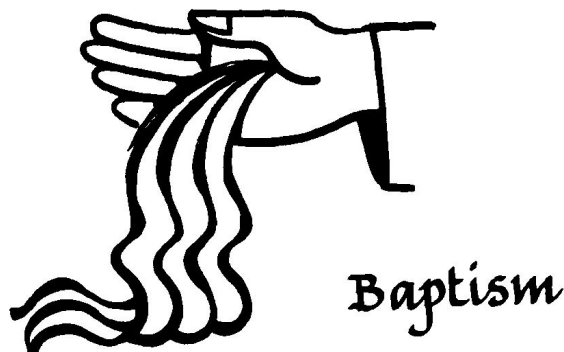



Remain standing

*Presider* The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

*The Candidate is presented by her Parents and Godparents, as follows*

*Parents & Godparents* I present Juniper Beth Solomon to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

*Presider* Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

*Parents & Godparents* I will, with God's help.

*Presider* Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

*Parents & Godparents* I will, with God's help.

*Presider* Do you desire to be baptized?

*Candidate* I do.

*Presider* Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

*Candidate & Sponsors* I renounce them.

*Presider* Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

*Candidate & Sponsors* *I renounce them.*

*Presider* Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

*Candidate & Sponsors* *I renounce them.*

*Presider* Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

*Candidate & Sponsors* *I do.*

*Presider* Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

*Candidate & Sponsors* *I do.*

*Presider* Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

*Candidate & Sponsors* *I do.*

*After the Candidate has been presented, the Presider addresses the congregation, saying*

*Presider* Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support Juniper in her life in Christ?

*People* **We will.**

*Presider* In fellowship with Juniper in her baptism, let us renew our own baptismal covenant.

## The Baptismal Covenant

*All remain standing*

*Presider* Do you believe in God the Father?

*People* **I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

*Presider* Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

*People* **I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

*Presider* Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

*People* **I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**

*Presider* Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

*People* **I will, with God's help.**

*Presider* Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

*People* **I will, with God's help.**

*Presider* Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

*People* **I will, with God's help.**

*Presider* Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

*People* **I will, with God's help.**

*Presider* Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

*People* **I will, with God's help.**

*Presider* Let us now pray for Juniper who is to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

*A Person appointed leads the following petitions*

*Leader* Deliver her, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

*People* **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*Leader* Open her heart to your grace and truth.

*People* **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*Leader* Fill her with your holy and life-giving Spirit.

*People* **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*Leader* Keep her in the faith and communion of your holy Church.

*People* **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*Leader* Teach her to love others in the power of the Spirit.

*People* **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*Leader* Send her into the world in witness to your love.

*People* **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*Leader* Bring her to the fullness of your peace and glory.

*People* **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*Presider* Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and for ever. **Amen.**

## Thanksgiving Over the Water

*Remain standing*

*Presider* The Lord be with you.

*People* **And also with you.**

*Presider* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

*People* **It is right to give God thanks and praise.**

*The Presider continues*

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

*At the following words, the Presider touches the water*

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior.

To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

## The Baptism

*Remain standing*

*The Presider pours water upon the Candidate, saying*

**Juniper**, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.  
**Amen.**

*Then the Priest places a hand on the Candidate's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross and saying*

**Juniper**, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. **Amen.**

*A candle, lit from the Christ candle, is presented*

**Juniper**, receive the Light of Christ. **Amen.**

*When this action has been completed, the Priest, at a place in full sight of the congregation, prays over her, saying*

Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant, the forgiveness of sin, and have raised her to the new life of grace. Sustain her, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give her an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen.**

*When the Candidate has been baptized, the Presider says*

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

*People*      **We receive you into the household of God.  
Confess the faith of Christ crucified,  
proclaim his resurrection,  
and share with us in his eternal priesthood.**

All thanks and praise are yours at all times and in all places, our true and loving God; through Jesus Christ, your eternal Word, the Wisdom from on high by whom you created all things.

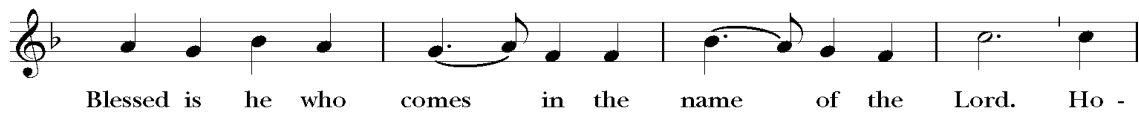
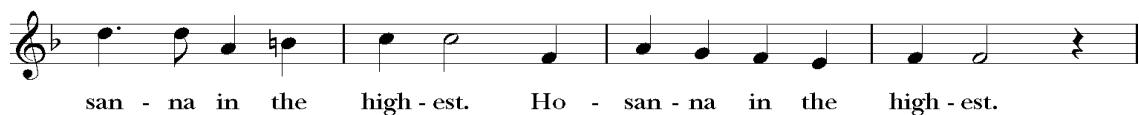
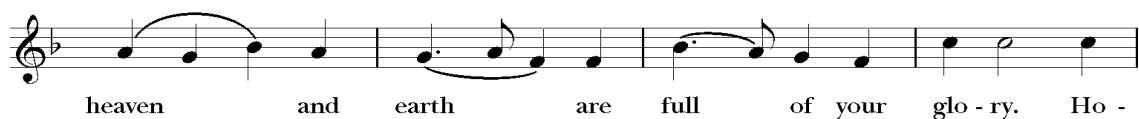
You laid the foundations of the world and enclosed the sea when it burst out from the womb; You brought forth all creatures of the earth and gave breath to humankind.

Send your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these gifts of bread and wine that they may be to us the Body and Blood of your Christ. Grant that we, burning with your Spirit's power, may be a people of hope, justice and love.

*The Presider then says*

Remember, Lord, our one holy catholic and apostolic Church, redeemed by the blood of your Christ. Reveal its unity, guard its faith, and preserve it in peace.

Remember Michael, Megan, Don, Robin, Wendy, and all who minister in your Church.

Remember Juniper baptized this day.

Remember all your people, and those who seek your truth.

Remember the leaders of the nations of the world, particularly in the areas of violence, conflict, and disaster.

Remember all those who are suffering and those who have asked for our prayers {*silence*}.

Remember all who have died in the peace of Christ, and those whose faith is known to you alone; bring them into the place of eternal joy and light.

*The Presider continues*

And grant that we may find our inheritance with the Blessed Virgin Mary and all the saints who have found favor with you in ages past. We praise you in union with them and give you glory through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, all honor and glory are yours, Almighty God and Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, for ever and ever. **AMEN.**

And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,

*People and Presider*

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread.
